“IS IT LAWFUL FOR A HUSBAND TO DIVORCE HIS WIFE?”

Today we hear a lot about marriage contracts. However, this is not what marriage is about. Marriage is not a contract but a covenant. A contract protects the participants in advance. It spells out what is expected of each party. A covenant does not do this. Instead it is an unconditional mutual pledge to love and serve one another forever. That pledge means for better or worse, for richer or poorer, in sickness and health, and in good times and bad.

Obviously, a covenant demands a great deal of maturity. This brings us to a painful reality in our modern society. Unfortunately, some marriages deteriorate so badly that sincere prayer and professional counseling fail to revive it. The church compassionately recognizes the sad reality of such a marriage. It permits physical separation of the couple whenever ardent prayer and counseling fail. Remarriage is possible only when one spouse dies or an annulment is granted.

An annulment is not a divorce. It is careful study and prayerful judgment by the Church that what seemed to be a sacramental marriage was not. Many stories have been circulated about the annulment process and most are not true. The one thing that bothered me the most about the annulment process was the length of time it took from beginning to end. In our Archdiocese, many times the process could take two years. However, Pope Francis recently set about to change many of the things that caused delay and anguish to those pursuing the process. His goal was to have these changes in place by December. As soon as possible, after the first of the year, we will be holding a question and answer session to explain the changes. As Pope Francis said, “You are never abandoned and always remember God Loves You.”
