A Message from Fr. Tony



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I've said often that the gospels give us a unique insight into the disciples of Jesus and they show them in all their humanity and weakness. Here we have this story of James and John who come to Jesus and ask that one would sit on his right and one on his left when he comes into his glory. Luke's version of this event tells us that the disciples had been arguing among themselves about who was the greatest. Clearly the disciples are ambitious for greatness, yet they do not understand what greatness means in the kingdom. Jesus tells them "You do not know what you are asking." True greatness is found in imitation of Christ who came not to be served, but to serve. The great challenge to us is that Jesus says to us "Love one another as I have loved you." And how did Jesus love us? The first reading from Isaiah prophesies about Jesus that "he gave his life as an offering for sin." He was willing to give his all for the sake of others and he calls us to love in the same way.

May God give us the grace to die to self and live for Him and for others.

Next Sunday, October 25th, is the day of our rededication as a parish. Bishop Cozzens will be the main celebrant at the 10:30am Mass and so I am asking all of you to make a special effort to attend that Mass. We will, of course, have our Saturday evening Mass and our Sunday 8:30 am Mass, but I would really love our church to be full as we celebrate this important milestone.

Mary Consecration Bible Study

In this last week of preparation before the rededication of Our Lady of the Lake, we look at the teachings of St. John Paul II. He consecrated himself to Mary at a very early age, and he wrote extensively on the graces that flow from her Immaculate Heart. His message to the people of Poland is credited with the beginning of the fall of Communism. He credits Mary with saving him from an assassin's bullet. Please join us and share how Mary can deepen your faith in her Son. The last classes will be on Monday at 6:30pm on October 19th & 26th, and on Tuesday at 1:30pm on October 20th & 27th. If you can't attend, please continue to read and meditate on the 33 Days to Morning Glory, and spend some time reflecting on your relationship with Mary, our Blessed Mother.

Mass Intentions

Offering a Mass for a specific intention dates back to the very early days of the Church. (Inscriptions have been found in catacombs dating back to the second century.) Intentions are requested most frequently for the souls of the deceased, but can also be in thanksgiving for a benefit received, or for a living person, such as on a birthday. The purpose of special intentions relates to the graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass. The Eucharistic prayers address the "communion of saints," those who have already made it to heaven, and those of us who are still pilgrims on this earth. All together, as the Body of Christ, we ask for the intercession of the saints to obtain these special graces for the identified person with the goal of attaining eternal life in heaven with God.

Listening Sessions with Archbishop Hebda to Help Inform Pope Francis' Choice for Our New Archbishop

Pope Francis has emphasized the importance of dialogue in the life of the Church. And in the spirit of speaking and listening in charity, the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis is hosting a series of listening sessions. Archbishop Hebda will lead the sessions to hear your input on our strengths, our challenges, and what characteristics are important in a new archbishop.

Feedback gathered during these sessions will be shared with those responsible for advising Pope Francis as he makes this important choice and with the new Archbishop whenever he is named. Summaries will be published in *The Catholic Spirit*.
