Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Saint Leo the Great, in his great homily on the feast of Christmas says, "Let us rejoice. Sadness should have no place on the birthday of life... No one is shut out from this joy; all share the same reason for rejoicing. Our Lord, victor over sin and death, finding no man free from sin, came to free us all." In this season, it is right that we rejoice because God is with us. This is the great message of the incarnation that God is indeed with us and He promises that He will lead us and guide us.



We have just begun the Jubilee Year of Mercy, instituted by Pope Francis. The Holy Father is calling us to reflect on the great beauty of the mercy of God for each one of us. He says, "Mercy will always be greater than any sin, and no one can place limits on the love of God who is ever ready to forgive." This is the essence of our faith; that God's love and mercy is greater than our sins. Just as we are called to receive the mercy of God, so we are called to show mercy to others. If there is someone you need to forgive, then now is the time of mercy because God's grace is available. If you know there is someone that you need to ask forgiveness of, then don't delay because God will help you.

As we welcome Christ in this season, let us pray with Saint John Paul II who prayed, "O Child, who willed to have for your crib a manger; O Creator of the universe, who stripped yourself of divine glory; O Redeemer, who offered your vulnerable body in sacrifice for the salvation of humanity: may the radiance of your birth light up the night of the world. You come to bring us peace. You are our peace! In the luminous silence of your Nativity, you, Emmanuel, continue to speak to us. And we are ready to listen to you. Amen!"
