Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Scriptures have sometimes been described as a great love story. They contain the story of God's great and faithful love for his people. Our first reading from the prophet Isaiah gives us an idea of the kind of love that God has for us: "No more shall people call you Forsaken, or your land Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight ... For the LORD delights in you." The Scriptures often use the image of married love as a way of describing God's love for us. It is no surprise then that the



first miracle of Jesus in the gospel of John takes place in the context of a wedding. It is at the wedding feast at Cana that Jesus reveals his glory and we see in symbolic form the abundance of the gift of the Holy Spirit in the abundance of the wine - It is the gift of the Holy Spirit that is given to us by the Father through Jesus. At the wedding feast of Cana, Mary says to the servants; "Do whatever he tells you." May we be filled with the New Wine of the Holy Spirit so that we may choose freely to do all that the Lord tells us to do and know the joy of true and lasting freedom.

This weekend we are being joined by Fr. Bill Voss and Liz Mach who have come to share about the work of the Maryknoll missionary group. Please welcome them warmly and be generous in supporting their ministry.
