Faith Formation

Family Faith Formation meets today (Sunday) at 9:30 am in the School Cafeteria. Our topic this month is Vocations and Holy Orders. Please continue to work on your textbooks each week at home!

Children’s Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) meets today at the 10:30am Mass. The children will be dismissed after the Opening Prayer and will return to their families at the Presentation of the Gifts. CLOW is an opportunity for the children to discuss and relate the Scripture readings to their everyday lives. No registration is required.

Classes for Grades 1-8 will resume this Wednesday, January 14th from 6:30-7:45pm.

What’s Happening Now?? Understanding the Mass

Prayers of the Faithful (General Intercessions). The Liturgy of the Word concludes with a collection of prayers. Usually, they are grouped into 4 categories: for the needs of the Church (for example, the Pope); for public authorities & salvation of the whole world; for those burdened by any kind of difficulty (such as the sick or injured); and for the local community (especially those who have died). This practice dates back to the Acts of the Apostles when Peter was imprisoned by Herod. He asked the church community to pray for him, and an angel came and freed him from the jail (Acts 12:1-7). St. Justin Martyr also writes in 155 A.D. about the early church practice of praying together as a church community. After humbly placing ourselves before God, and listening to His Word, we pray for His intercession in our daily struggles. **Think about:** Do I really believe that God will answer my prayers to Him?



Bible Study A new Bible Study will begin on Jan. 26th & 27th, which explores the Gospel of Mark. The Sunday readings for this liturgical year are primarily from this Gospel, which is thought to be the first of the four that were written. We will be using the Seven Days with the Gospel of Mark as our study guide. The book is available in the Church Office for \$5.00. The book may also be used as a personal devotion for those who cannot attend the class. This will be a 7-week program, using the guide’s morning & evening reflection for each session. Classes will be held on Mondays at 6: 30pm or Tuesdays at 1: 30pm in the Library.

RCIA During the month of January, we will be discussing the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. We begin with a general overview and then look at each of them individually, along with the special graces that come with each one. Class sessions are open to all parishioners who wish to learn more about the faith, and are held on Thursday nights in the Library in the back of the Church. (Please note, there is no class on January 15th.)

The Westonka Food Shelf

The Westonka Food Shelf had 446 visits in December, 2014. We provided service to 255 families, many of them taking advantage of a supplementary weekly service for perishable items. We also provided Christmas baskets to 267 families.

The Westonka Food Shelf began 2014 serving just under 200 families per month. By the last quarter, we were serving over 240 families monthly. We made many changes during 2014, including the installation of a "food rescue" program with the Lund's Navarre market, and heavy reliance on two local food banks. As such, we are now distributing substantially more pounds of food to our clients each month than we were at the beginning of the year, while actually decreasing our costs! By leveraging our buying power with food banks & matching grants, we are able to stretch a dollar donation into \$9 or more worth of food. Our "food rescue" program enables us to offer fresh produce year-round as well as provide quality cuts of meat, deli products & a variety of perishable items. It has also allowed us to offer supplementary weekly service to patrons, who may now stop in once a week for a bag or two of perishable produce or bakery items. We are proud to report that our patrons recently completed surveys in which they overwhelmingly expressed satisfaction with their experiences at the Westonka Food Shelf during the year.

We would like to thank our 36 wonderful volunteers & our volunteer Board of Directors. They all work countless hours to ensure we serve our patrons as effectively as possible. We are pleased to also have the enthusiasm of great youth volunteers who have supported our efforts in amazing ways. We also thank Our Lady of the Lake Church for generously providing our facility "rent free" and without maintenance costs. This allows us to use 100% of donations for the direct procurement of food. We are blessed to have the support of our many local churches and their parishioners. We are extremely grateful for the support of Gale Woods Farms, Jubilee Foods, and Lund's Navarre. Finally, we want to thank our donors, local businesses, and organizations who generously support our mission to end hunger in our area.
