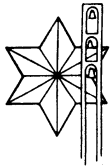

Accompanied by the Holy Spirit

Sometimes it is difficult to get to know the Holy Spirit. We have ideas of what a father is to associate with God the Father, and Jesus came to earth and took a human body, but the Holy Spirit is not quite as simple to picture. Although it takes some work, we can and must have a relationship with the Holy Spirit. One way to increase our relationship with him is to reflect upon the titles and symbols that we have for the Holy Spirit. One title we see often is *Paraclete*.

In different parts of the Bible, *paraclete* is commonly translated as “advocate,” “counselor,” or “comforter.” We can take each of those terms and reflect on the Holy Spirit’s role in our lives as each of those things. An advocate is one who pleads our cause for us. A counselor helps us to make wise decisions. A comforter is there with us in times of sorrow. They are all different roles, but they all come from this same word, this same job of the Holy Spirit, *paraclete*.

There is not one simple word in English to sum up what it means to be a paraclete. The literal translation from the Greek word is, “he who is called to one’s side.” At different times in our lives we have different needs, but the Holy Spirit’s job is to be the one at our side in each of those seasons. When we pray, “Come, Holy Spirit,” we are asking for the one who has the power to provide for our needs, to be with us as a companion and helper. St. John Vianney, when reflecting upon that role, said:

The good God, in sending us the Holy Spirit, has treated us like a great king who should send his minister to guide one of his subjects, saying, ‘You will accompany this man everywhere, and you will bring him back to me safe and sound.’ How beautiful it is, my children, to be accompanied by the Holy Spirit!

It is indeed beautiful to be accompanied by the Holy Spirit in life. On this Pentecost Sunday, let us together grow in our ability to recognize the ways in which the Holy Spirit is truly present in our lives and in our parish.

What's Happening Now? Understanding the Mass

The Sign of Peace. Following the "Our Father," the priest addresses Jesus and asks Him to grant us the same peace that He left to His apostles: Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." (John 14:27) Again, He is referring to the peace that comes only from following the will of the Father, as Jesus did. This peace is the source of unity among all people, especially within the Church. The priest then addresses the people and states: "The peace of the Lord be with you always." These same words can be found in many of Paul's letters to the early churches. Our response to this is: "And with your spirit." This is now the fourth time that we make this request. And then the priest asks us to ... "offer each other the sign of peace." Normally, this is a shaking of hands with those around us. In the early church, it was a "holy kiss," as Paul exhorts the Christians in his letters. (Romans 16:16; 1 Cor. 16:20) This is meant as an expression of unity as we all come together to receive the Eucharist. **Think about:** Does receiving Holy Communion bring me closer to unity with others and to finding that inner peace from Christ?

In weeks 1 & 2, Fr. Barron talked about Jesus as the ultimate priest, fulfilling what was lacking in the priests of the Old Testament. In week 3, he will describe Christ's role as a "prophet."
