A Message from Fr. Tony

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This July 4th weekend we celebrate the great freedom that we enjoy in this country. It is a time to give thanks for the many blessings that we have and the wealth of opportunity that we have here. We value our freedom, and rightly so, but it's important to understand what true freedom is. The Catechism of our Church says: "The right to the exercise of freedom, especially in religious and moral matters, is an inalienable requirement of the dignity of man. But the exercise of freedom does not entail the right to say or do anything."



Moral theologians speak of two types of freedom. One is what they call the freedom of indifference - which is the freedom that says "I can do whatever I want." The other freedom spoken of is what is called the "freedom for excellence" - this is the freedom to pursue the "good," the moral excellence for which we were made. Again, the Catechism says: "Freedom attains its proper perfection when it is directed toward God, the highest good... The choice of evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to the slavery of sin."

With the gift of freedom that we experience comes great responsibility to use our freedom for the glory of God and for the benefit of our neighbor. May God give us the grace to never use our freedom for evil, but only for the good.

I also want to let you know that Fr. Nate LaLiberte, the new pastor of the parish of St. Maximilian Kolbe in Delano, is now residing in the rectory here at OLL. Fr. Nate is a member of the Companions of Christ and was also a classmate of mine in Seminary. As Companions of Christ, we try to live together in community whenever our assignments allow us, sharing prayer and fraternity. I am very glad to welcome Fr. Nate. It is likely that you won't see too much of him because of his responsibilities, but please pray for him as he takes on his new role and please pray for the Companions of Christ.

What's Happening Now? Understanding the Mass

Prayer after Communion When the distribution of Communion is complete, the priest purifies the paten and chalice, and again says a prayer: "What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what has been given to us in time may be our healing for eternity." During this time, there is generally a period of silence or time of reflection. This is a time to thank God for all the graces and blessings that He continues to bestow upon us, even in our unworthiness. The priest now stands and says, "Let us pray." This is the concluding prayer which is reflective of the mystery that has just occurred and a petition that we incorporate into our lives what we have just received from God. **Think about:** How can we more completely bring Christ into our lives?
