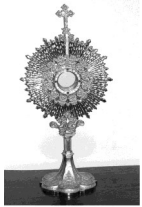

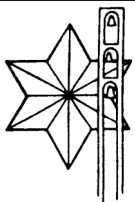
## Eucharistic Adoration ~ New Hours on Tuesdays

### GRACE FAMILY CENTER UPDATE

You may have noticed equipment and earth moving at the construction site for the Grace Family Center, future new home of the Westonka Food Shelf and Pennywise Shop, next to the OLL School playground. Once permitting issues were resolved we were able to take advantage of continued mild weather to excavate for the foundation and pour footings. Work has been put on hold, however, since further construction would necessitate providing heat, which would raise project costs. Fundraising for the Grace Family Center has topped the \$600,000 goal, however new requirements that were made during the permitting process have added at least \$100,000 to the cost of the project. The Fundraising committee is re-doubling its efforts to close the gap, focusing on reaching out to the wider community for participation.

## WHEN I WAS HUNGRY YOU FED ME OR NAKED YOU CLOTHED ME!

I once heard someone say, "That each and every one of us could be a job, a divorce, an illness or an addiction from being homeless and on the streets."

I have had the opportunity to be able to serve our brothers and sisters that have found themselves in a position where they must turn to various groups to provide food, clothing, and shelter for mere existence. This place is called Opportunity Center and is part of Catholic Charities.

Opportunity Center serves those in need with breakfast and lunch six days a week, access to social workers, medical services, job placement, culinary training, computers to access job postings, sole care for their feet as this is their mode of transportation.

I serve in the laundry and shower areas of the Center. I was asked what I do in this area and my answer is that our group helps provide dignity to those we serve. Our clients can wash and dry their clothes, shower in private, receive hygiene products and, when available, a clean new pair of socks. All of these are things that most of us take for granted. However, this is important for our friends that we serve and I don't know how many times I have been told, "I feel like a new person after putting on clean clothes and taking a hot shower."

I am often asked, "What can I do to help?" First and foremost, pray for those in need of our services. Second, when our CCW puts on Drives for items to help provide that dignity to our brothers and sisters, help in any way possible.

Finally, I would ask that you keep Jesus Christ in your hearts and you will recognize his face in every human being. You will want to help him out in all his needs: the needs of your brothers and sisters. This is the way we prepare ourselves to meet Jesus, when he comes again on the last day, as the judge of the living and the dead.

And as it says in Matthew 25, "When did we see you hungry and feed you or see you thirsty and give you drink? When did we welcome you away from home or clothe you in your nakedness? When did we visit you when you were ill or in prison?" The king will answer them, "I assure you, as often as you did it for one of my least brothers or sisters, you did it for me."
