Dear Brothers and Sisters,



As you know, these past few years we have been experiencing difficult times as an Archdiocese with regard to the sexual abuse claims against a number of priests. As a result of the three year lifting of the statute of limitations (Child Victims Act), it is anticipated that a significant number of parishes implicated in the Archdiocese sexual abuse claims will be sued by claimants. In addition, many other parishes in Minnesota (outside the Archdiocese) will be sued before the May 25, 2016, statute of limitations deadline. For the most part, these are not new claims, but claims that arise out of alleged misconduct occurring many years ago.

Our parish may be one of several sued by sex abuse claimants in the next four to six weeks. The parish trustees and I have been aware of the claim for a number of months. However, despite our knowledge of the claim, there was a strict confidentiality order issued by the United States Bankruptcy Court which restricted parishes from notifying their parishioners until now. The claim concerns a priest who served Our Lady of the Lake a number of decades ago. The Archdiocese and parish attorneys/counsel are making every effort to resolve these cases in the course of the ongoing bankruptcy proceedings. We expect that any lawsuit will not affect the normal operations of the parish, and the case will be resolved in a fair and equitable manner in the coming months.

Inserted in our bulletin you will find a letter from Archbishop Hebda along with some Questions and Answers which may be helpful in understanding our situation. As I have said before, this is a time to entrust ourselves to God and to pray especially for the victims of such terrible abuse. I am happy to make myself available to answer questions, if helpful.
