In our Gospel for this second Sunday of Advent, we encounter the figure of John the Baptist. John the Baptist was the Lord’s forerunner, the one who was sent to be the one crying out in the wilderness. The scriptures tell us that John was sent by God to be a witness...a witness to the light. He witnessed about the light of the world - Christ himself. Mass Intentions Offering a Mass for a specific intention dates back to the very early days of the Church. (Inscriptions have been found in catacombs dating back to the second century.) Intentions are requested most frequently for the souls of the deceased, but can also be in thanksgiving for a benefit received, or for a living person, such as on a birthday. The purpose of special intentions relates to the graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass. The Eucharistic prayers address the "communion of saints," those who have already made it to heaven, and those of us who are still pilgrims on this earth. All together, as the Body of Christ, we ask for the intercession of the saints to obtain these special graces for the identified person with the goal of attaining eternal life in heaven with God.
